- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Discount Pricing Con-
- 5 sumer Protection Act of 2009".

1 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON MINIMUM RESALE PRICE MAINTE-

- 2 NANCE.
- 3 Any agreement setting a price below which a product
- 4 or service cannot be sold by a retailer, wholesaler, or dis-
- 5 tributor shall violate section 1 of the Sherman Act (15
- 6 U.S.C. 1).
- 7 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.
- 8 This Act shall take effect 90 days after the date of
- 9 the enactment of this Act.
